Rescuing Quality Food to Nourish and Strengthen Our Community

Aloha Harvest is the largest food rescue and redistribution organization in Hawai'i. Free of charge and free of liability, Aloha Harvest picks up quality excess food from donors (grocery stores, restaurants, hotels) and redistributes it to recipient agencies feeding the hungry (homeless shelters, social services, food pantries). Last year, we worked with 414 food donors and 148 recipient agencies to redistribute over 3 million pounds of food that would have otherwise been wasted!

- Smells funny

- Sell by date past six months
- Avoid cans with rust, dirt, or soil that does not wipe off
- Signs of insects, mold, or droppings
- Evidence of exposure to extreme temperatures
