211 Information and Referral Service (Desig. # 80106)

211 is a free, confidential service offered statewide for people who need help. Last year, we connected the community with over 3,540 government, non-profit and human service agencies. We received over 23,775 calls, which resulted in over 30,000 referrals. Our 211 website handled over 45,000 searches for help.

Get Connected/Gifts-in-Kind (Desig. # 80107)

Connecting the community with volunteer opportunities and connecting “gently used” items with non-profit organizations and those most in need. Last year, we connected 300 non-profits to potential volunteers and were able to donate \$195,000 in gifts-in-kind.

This group receives our Aloha United Way “seal of approval,” which assures you, as the donor, that this network of local nonprofit partners we work with are spending donated dollars wisely through thorough financial and program delivery review by community volunteers.
