\$652,500 to be awarded in this impact area

Vision: All children in our community are provided adequate tools, resources, and support to succeed in school. Students are prepared for kindergarten, meet reading proficiency guidelines, transition successfully into middle school, graduate from high school on time, and successfully enter college or the workforce.

Strategies: **Increase percent of children who receive early childhood developmental screenings and follow up, as needed - \$78,885.75**
