Compassion for Cancer Caregivers

Agency Needs

If your company has scheduled deliveries to Molokai or Kauai, we'd welcome an opportunity to partner with you on sending compassion kits to Molokai General Hospital and Wilcox Medical Center on Kauai with your shipment of your products. Depending on space availability, this could be monthly, every other month, or quarterly.

Compassion kits are designed for cancer caregivers (the unsung hero on the cancer care team) or the cancer patient. Kits are composed of a bright lime green zippered tote bag, a plush fleece lap blanket, an adult coloring book with a set of coloring pencils and a sharpener, an ear bud with mic, a couple of colorful notepad journals, our brochure, and a cheerful note of hope and gratitude.

The response to these kits on Oahu has been overwhelmingly positive. They are distributed at the cancer centers at Queen's, Queen's West, Pali Momi, Kapiolani Women's and Children's, Hawaii Cancer Care and the American Cancer Society's Hope Lodge. We are now expanding to the neighbor islands.

- 📁 Cleaning supplies, Lysol or Clorox wipes - helps newly independent young people save their income or have adequate supplies to maintain their new homes.
- 📁 Cell phones with pre-paid minutes - gives young adults without the funds the ability to be contacted by health providers, potential employers, and family.

- 📁 Grocery store gift cards - Most of our young people are low income, some are homeless, and any food is helpful. Those with homes and families can buy a turkey, ham and some fresh vegetables for themselves and their families.
- 📁 Starbucks or Coffee Bean - Meeting over coffee is a luxury that helps youth feel normal in a relaxed environment that's comfortable for them.
- 📁 McDonalds, Taco Bell, Pizza Hut, Panda Express, Wendy's - Most of our young people are low income, some are homeless, and any food is helpful. Gives youth a chance to eat out like normal young people, a chance to meet in an informal social setting over food or snacks without being dependent on others to buy food for them.
- 📁 Walmart - Young people can purchase needed items for their home, school, or personal hygiene.
- 📁 Bus passes

A group of nonprofits building a unified voice for Hawaii's ALICE population through education and advocacy for policy development and systems level change.
